## Nine Factors in Happiness

The Sociology Department of Duke University did a study on peace of mind and happiness. They found nine factors that were most likely to contribute to mental and emotional stability. They were:

- 1. Absence of suspicion and resentment. Trusting and avoiding grudges were important.
- Living in the present and future. Brooding over past mistakes and experiences created unhappiness.
- 3. Recognizing conditions that can't be changed. Learning to live with them.
- Cooperating with life instead of running away from it.
- 5. Forcing yourself to be outgoing with others rather than retreating within,

- especially during periods of emotional stress.
- Refusing to pity yourself or make alibis for your actions.
- 7. Cultivating old-fashioned virtues of love, honor, loyalty, thrift.
- 8. Not expecting too much of yourself. If there is a wide gap between what you think you can do and the reality of what you can do, unhappiness will result.
- Finding something bigger than yourself in which to believe. Self-centered, egotistical, and materialistic people score lowest of all in any test for measuring happiness.
