

#### Signature Credit

Signature Credit is a reserved line of credit tied to a customer's checking account that can be accessed by simply writing a check. The purpose of this service is to prevent overdrafts as well as provide a mechanism for small-dollar, recurring loans which are usually under \$5,000; however, higher lines of credit are available. Signature Credit is offered through two areas in the bank. A full application can be picked up in the New Accounts and Private Banking areas. All completed applications are forwarded to Glenda Lane in the Private Banking area for processing.

As an employee, if you would like to apply for Signature Credit, pick up an application from the New Accounts or Private Banking area.

**Bill Attal** has been promoted to vice president, trust officer, and manager of the corporate services group.


**Beverly Scott** has been promoted to vice president and trust officer, Personal Trust.

## The big eight . . . reasons to exercise

#### ONE

You'll feel better! The more active you are, the more energetic you feel. Exercise improves the efficiency of the lungs and the circulatory system. And it increases the supply of glycogen, a muscle fuel, to make you feel less fatigued.

#### TWO

You'll be more attractive. If you do not exercise, the ratio of body fat to lean muscle tissue goes up. At the same weight, you'll have a thicker waist, wider hips, and your body will not be as firm. As muscle strength declines, the position of the skeletal frame changes. Everything sags.

#### THREE

Your bones will be stronger. As Dr. Lila Wallis of Cornell Medical Center puts it, "The three preferred methods of prevention of osteoporosis are exercise, exercise, exercise."

#### **FOUR**

It's good for your blood pressure. Several studies show regular exercise reduces blood pressure in both normal and hypertensive people. It increases the flexibility of artery walls.

#### **FIVE**

Your appetite will be reduced. Besides burning calories, regular exercise for an hour a day suppresses hunger and increases the rate at which calories are burned for as long as six hours afterward.

#### SIX

Your heart will be stronger! Exercise strengthens the heart muscle. Regular exercise at Duke University for cardiovascular patients resulted in an average improvement in treadmill time of 45 percent within three months.


#### **SEVEN**

You'll smile more. People who exercise regularly are more likely to be relaxed, optimistic, energetic, better disciplined and sleep better. Even patients suffering from depression improved significantly when they exercised regularly.

#### **EIGHT**

You'll be more effective at work! Fit employees are better workers. Studies show they have better energy, higher productivity, and better emotional balance in times of stress.

If you plan to begin an exercise program, check with your doctor about the plan you have selected. But as the New England Journal of Medicine reports, physical inactivity is far more detrimental to health than any hazards of exercise.
