On July 15, 1985, First City launched a major statewide deposit generation program to run through December 31, 1985. We have been successful in creating community awareness of our "high interest rates *plus* high interest gifts" program.

The promotion offers customers an up-front gift as well as a competitive interest rate. The deposit promotion includes time deposits (CDs from six months to five years) and transaction accounts (DDA, Savings, NOW, Money Market Savings, and Checking Accounts).

The deposit generation program is intended to:

- expand our customer base;
- continue to build core deposits;
 and
- continue to cross sell existing customers into additional services.

The worry about the car breaking down or a family member forgetting to pick them up made Mrs. I. ask AISD to allow the children to transfer from their assigned school to Allison Elementary because it offered an Extend-A-Care Center.

The new after-school experience has helped the children to become more independent. They have learned to swim, thus enabling them to go to special summer camps. Mrs. I. says Extend-A-Care has helped her children learn to deal with people and make friends easily. She is also grateful for the Center's efforts in helping control asthma attacks in her youngest son. "It's like 50 lbs. off me to be able to depend on Extend-A-Care," she says.

Once again, we will hold scheduled meetings for all employees which will give an overview of how United Way serves the Austin Community.
