Austin Aqua Festival

The Austin Aqua Festival celebrates its 25th Anniversary this year with nine action-packed Fest Nights beginning August 1. Auditorium Shores is the site for this year's extravaganza starting at 6:30 Friday night and continuing through Sunday afternoon August 10. The grounds have been expanded to accommodate this year's Silver Anniversary Festival.

All musical tastes and preferences will be satisfied with the wide assortment of national as well as local entertainment featured this year. More than 100 bands will be seen and heard on any one of the five stages at Aqua Fest. Between sets you can visit arts & crafts booths or feast on fest food and drinks. A new feature at this year's festival is Ninfa's Express/KBVO-TV: Ninfa's Cantina, where not only can you listen to live music, but you can pick up a

hot Mexican dinner. In addition to the stage at Ninfa's Cantina, you can catch live acts at the Miller Lite/KEY-103: Center Stage, Austin Coca-Cola Bottling Co./KVET/KASE 101: East Stage, Minute Maid/Sonic Drive-In/KLBJ-FM: West Stage, and the AT&T/KTVV-TV: Austin Stage. For the young people the ever-popular K-98: Midway and the 24-KVUE: Little Fest will feature carnival rides.

Aqua Fest culminates with the Night-Lighted Water Parade followed by the Fireworks Display Friday, August 8 and the 25th Anniversary Birthday Bash August 9.

Friday, August 1 is the last day you can pick up your Skipper Pins (\$2) at the Information Desk in the Lobby; and to avoid the crowded parking conditions at Auditorium Shores during Aqua Fest, park at Austin High School and ride the shuttle.

Revamped Diploma System Under New AIB Educational Program

A new diploma system will get under way this semester. The new system standardizes the requirements for diplomas across the nation and makes picking up a second diploma easier. If you're close to getting your diploma under the old system, not to worry. You can get diplomas under the old system until 1989. You may want to check into the new system, though; you can switch without losing credit.

The ACC Assessment Policy

In an effort to help the college better match students with the appropriate courses, ACC has established an Assessment Policy. All new or prospective ACC students who have fewer than 12 college credit hours must be assessed in reading, writing, math and educational preparedness prior to entering ACC or during their first semester at ACC. (If you are taking an AIB course that offers no ACC credit, assessment is not required.) There is no cost to the student for assessment and there are some exemptions. To set up an assessment time or to find out if you qualify for exemption, contact Sharon Adamcik, ext. 4858.

For those of you asking whether the Employee Referral Award Program is still in existence, the answer is a definite Y-E-S! Because the program has not received quite as much attention as of late, some employees have wondered if it has been discontinued. For the year, employee referrals dominate as the prominent source for new hires—your referrals are vital to the continued success of the program.

The rules and awards for the program remain the same. A \$150 award is paid (after 90 days) for referred applicants subsequently employed into non-exempt positions, grades 3-5; and for grades 6-9 a \$300 award is paid.

The Employee Referral Award Program has been a tremendous success in the past and with your input it will continue to be in the future.
