
TRUST REFERRAL PROGRAM - 1987

In an effort to bring prospective Trust customers together with First City's Trust Officers, the <u>First City National Bank of Austin Trust Referral Program - 1987</u> was kicked off March 1. The program is designed to reward those employees whose referrals result in the closing of Trust new business, and all full-time employees at FC Austin and FC Northwest Hills are eligible to participate.

Trust prospects should be referred to a Trust Officer on a Blue Prospect Card. These cards are available in Trust. Referrals may be made by personal introduction, by letter or by telephoning a prospect to arrange an appointment with a Trust Officer.

Your referral award will be paid to you one month after the new account has been placed on the Trust Department books and you must be employed by First City on the payment date. While the referral will be void if the sale is not completed within one year, there is no limit to the number of referrals or prospects you can submit.

Final determination of qualifying business will be made by the Trust Department's Senior Management. The Trust Division reserves the right to modify the program without notice.
