## Austin Adopt-A-School

The Fourth Annual "Adopt-A-School Salute to AISD" was held Wednesday, May 13. Our Chairman and Chairman

of the Adopt-A-School Executive Committee, John Scurlock, was the Master of Ceremonies for the evening. The highest honor, the "Adopter of the Year," went to the Austin American-Statesman, a partner of Sanchez Elementary School. (First City was the first to receive this honor in 1985.) According to Ed Leo, the principal at Sanchez, the Statesman had gone far beyond his dreams in providing the children of Sanchez with the educational assistance they needed during this school year.

Mr. Scurlock reported to the group that 4,068 volunteers donated 31,672 hours to Austin schools this past year. The value of that time is estimated at more than \$220,000.

As part of the celebration that evening Austin CableVision televised the salute live on AISD Cable Channel 8.

### RECEPTION HONORS TEACHERS

Teachers and staff of our 3 adopted schools were recognized Monday afternoon at a reception on the 15th Floor. As part of First City's Adopt-A-School Teacher Recognition Program, 200 teachers and staff of Zavala, Casis and McCallum schools were honored. ## CASIS BUZZES WITH A+ SPELLERS

Irene Wendland, AVP in Data Customer Support, reports that the spirit of competition is alive and well in the Austin Independent School District:

First City just completed another one of its Adopt-A-School projects! This was the "Annual AISD 3rd-Grade City-Wide Spelling Bee," held at Casis Elementary School on May 1. You talk about a great experience--this was one of them. Haven't seen such competition, tension and determination in quite some time! There were 36 students from 18 Austin area schools who participated in this contest. About 8:30 a.m. the students and their instructors started arriving at Casis; you could feel the anticipation in the air. Some (or even most) of it was coming from the parents who came to lend moral support to their children. The contest began at 9 a.m. sharp and ran through noon. The process of elimination was very slow due to the students being so well versed. Consequently, a total of 419 words were called out during the contest! Observing the confidence and competitive spirit in those youngsters was truly a heart-warming experience. HATS OFF to the two youngsters who came out on top: Sarah Hawkins of Manchaca Elementary, who came in 1st place, and Elizabeth Herron of Wooten Elementary School, who came in 2nd. But don't forget the other 34 entrants: they were already winners when they entered the city-wide contest. Prior to this, the youngsters had entered spelling contests within their schools; the 1st and 2nd place winners in all the participating schools were then eligible to enter the city-wide contest. I was truly honored to share the judging of this high-spirited competition with Dr. Timy Baranoff, Director of Elementary School Curriculum. I also want to extend my thanks to Kit Coman - Finance, Ann Dunn - Trust and Janice Ross - Loan Adjustment for all the time and hard work they put into this very worthwhile project.
