The 26th birthday of the Austin Aqua Festival is just around the bend and while pre-festival events have been going on throughout July, the Festival itself kicks off next Friday. Aqua Festival events take place all day long at many locations all over the city, but Fest Nights take place at the Fest Grounds located on Town Lake at Auditorium Shores from 6:30 p.m. until 1 a.m.

Highlights of Fest Nights are the non-stop musical acts that perform on the three stages each night during Aqua Fest. On Sunday, August

2, Kenny Loggins will perform on the Miller Lite/KVET KASE 101/KLBJ-AM 590 Center Stage. Following the discovery of the dead bodies of 27 youths in the Houston area in August of 1973, Governor Dolph Briscoe instituted a hotline service. This service provided an anonymous means for young runaways to let their loved ones know they were

an anonymous means for young runaways to let their loved ones know they were alive. Initially called "Operation Peace of Mind," this service is now known as the "Runaway Hotline."

The Hotline is a toll-free nationwide service for runaway children, operated by volunteers 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. One such volunteer is Ed Piner, SVP in Corporate Services. According to Ed this volunteer work is highly rewarding. You actually talk to runaways or potential runaways on the phone. He emphasizes that this is not a clearinghouse to put parents in touch with their kids, but rather a way for runaways to let their families know that they are okay. Ed says the most important quality for a volunteer is to be a good listener. As you might imagine, training for this type of volunteer work is extensive. In addition to a number of hours spent role playing in training sessions, you apprentice with an experienced volunteer before you're totally on your own.
